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

Dear Mr. Bromley:

We have reviewed our previous proposals and mutual conference data since our meeting yesterday at the Hamilton County Courthouse. The following proposal represents our recommendations for a minimum project to accomplish the "probability" objectives we discussed, namely to establish the water table surface on and around the sanitary landfill area, to obtain certified hard data on the present water supply on the property, and to do those things we consider necessary to protect the environment in and around the property.

### We Propose:

- 1. To drill and set sealed casing in 4 holes, six inches in diameter, on the four sides and in four different topographic positions to provide a necessary and continuing access to the water table.
- To provide four, complete, water quality analyses (one from each hole) using Army Engineer Standards, covering 82 tests each, to be taken under witness, protected to laboratory, and the results to be certified.
- 3. Construct a reconnaissance, regional water table map of the property and its surrounding area, 400-scale, 20-foot contours, showing the location, elevation, type depth, owner, depth to water (if possible) and other pertinent data, This will be done on a completely confidential basis and will provide a basis for any future studies you might wish to undertake.
- 4. All supervision of above, drafting, secretarial services, printing, copying, telephone, our insurance, transportation, and other field expenses, and water-sampling. (3 copies of final report)

Costs: Using the \$5.75 per foot cost including casing, which you obtained we estimate 500 feet of drilling and a total estimated cost of \$2,875 For items 2, 3, and 4 we will submit a firm cost of 4,975

Est. Total \$7,850

This proposal is submitted for your acceptance and is subject to payment of invoice on delivery of final reports to you. We thank you for the opportunity to submit this proposal and will start work upon receipt of your work or purchase order.

Dear Judge Frost:

We were glad to meet with you and your staff and members of the State Solid Waste Management Division last week regarding the Hamilton County sanitary landfill. We have now reviewed all phases of the design development and its implementation, as well as current operating practices and conditions.

We have checked the construction bi-weekly since it started and have closely inspected the actual operations three times in the last ten days. We can state emphatically that it is as well organized and operated as any we have seen to date, better than most! We have been particularly concerned with the implementation of our design for Site A (where solid wastes are now deposited). A preliminary State report refered to areas of sink holes (we found only one small depression on the total property) and areas of unsuitable soils because of the presence of large chert blocks. Our design carefully selected areas to specifically avoid both of these and to effectively use minimum cover material, or excavation, for maximum use of the full thickness of overburden available. Actual practice at this point has proven the concept—you have no chert problem, you are using only 5-6/feet of average cover leaving over 40 feet for bedrock zone protection (far exceeding national standards), and all other phases including corrective drainage are now operable.

With the above in mind, we have prepared and submitted a Proposal to Mr. John Bromley regarding further test work to satisfy any remaining question concerning pollution from the site. This Proposal covers six main points:

1. Depth to and surface of the water table on the property; 2. Slope of this water table and effect and relationship to the local area; 3. Direct testing of the site with certified high quality sampling and analytical techniques;

4. Geological analysis of the results; 5. Provision for permanent monitoring of the system; and 6. Presentation of all resulting data.

The net result of the proposed program will be to demonstrate effectively the minimizing of the probablilty of any sub-surface pollution of the water table now or in the future. While anything is possible in this world of ours, we believe the implementation of this study will show that it is extremely unlikely that any pollution can occur as a result of the proper operation of this sanitary landfill. You, and your staff, are to be congratulated on the meticulous way in which our planning has been used and for the actual operation of the site. Please call on us if you have further questions.

The requirements of these regulations:

- 1. Shall not apply to any subdivisions or plats recorded prior to February 14, 1935.
- 2. Shall not apply to divisions and plats of land partitioned by the owners among themselves, either in court or by deeds.
- 3. Shall not apply to the subdivision of land which will produce tracts of greater than two (2) acres in size; when no road or street is to be constructed with the intentions of dedicating said road or street to the public, and when the resulting tracts are to be used for agricultural purposes.

AND WHEREAS, after receipt of this recommendation the Hamilton County Council caused an ad to be placed in the newspapers of general circulation on September 12, 1972,



- 2. PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT: Insure the residential character of the area remains in tact.
- 3. SIZE OF TRACT: Approximately 2, 284 acres
- 4. ACCESS TO TRACT: Adequate via Banks Road, Standifer Gap Road, Jenkins Road, and Igou Gap Road
- 5. SITE CHARACTERISTICS: Rolling
- 6. SURROUNDING DEVELOPMENT: Primarily residential, with open land
- 7. EXTENSION OF EXISTING ZONE: Yes, in some instances

### STAFF RECOMMENDATION: Continued

- 3. It is recommended that certain specific areas retain the Agricultural zoning classification (specific locations and reasons are discussed in the following section).
- 4. The remainder of the study area should be rezoned R-1.

### 10. REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION:

Pursuant to a request by the Hamilton County Council and the citizens living within the subject area, a detailed study of said area was conducted by the Chattanooga-Hamilton County Regional Planning Commission in order to determine the type of zoning which would be the most suitable and equitable to the inhabitants of the area and to derive maximum benefit from the land and uses thereof.

Several important factors were taken into consideration in order to make this determination: existing land use and zoning and degree of soil, slope and bedrock limitation to residential development with septic tank.

A complete survey was made of the current land use and zoning to determine those areas which should retain their present zoning disposition due to the nature of their specific use (i.e., the spot commercial zones) and to insure conformity to the pattern of growth within the area.

The Land Capabilities Study was used to show the natural limitations which would inhibit certain types of development; particularly residential. Factors taken under consideration are soil type, degree of slope and severity of bedrock formation.

The soil types which pose severe limitations on reisdential development (with septic tank) are as follows:

Type 4: Deep, silty, bottomland soils, unsuited for residential development because of slow percolation and possible stream overflow.

Type 6: Deep, cherty soils, unsuited for development due to steep slopes.

Type 8: Areas of yellow and red clay unsuited for development because of slow percolation and severe bedrock formation.

### REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION, continued

There are several areas within the subject area which are severly limited for residential development with septic tanks because the degree of slope is too severe (in excess of 25%).

The Commercial or Local Business zones should remain the same because of already existing or proposed Commercial uses in these areas. The extension of the area mentioned in the recommendation section is proposed in order to conform to the plan for a neighborhood commercial center as shown in the 1985 General Plan.

The properties proposed to be zoned as Agricultural are those areas which are currently used for specific agricultural purposes (i.e., pasture or grazing land).

The only areas recommended to remain in this zone for that particular purpose lie: 1) north and south of Shallowford Road and east of Jenkins Road and 2) north of Igou Gap Road, immediately east of Haven Crest Drive. It should be noted that the use within the second area (poultry raising) is incompatible with the character of the surrounding land which is primarily Single-family Residential.

The property on which the new mental hospital will be located should remain zoned Agricultural, as construction of the facility has already been approved and no other zoning category allows this type of use. The East Brainerd Recreation Center is another use which is appropriately zoned Agricultural, and should remain so.

The other "spot" areas of Agricultural zoning (shown on the map) are recommended to be so zoned because there are severe limitations for other types of development due to extreme slope and poor soils.

It is recommended that the remainder of the study area be zoned R-1, to allow for expansion of the single-family residential sections and to restrict development of such uses as duplexes, as they would not conform to the existing pattern and character of development of the area. It should also be noted that 10,000 sq. ft. lots cannot be subdivided without a soil survey for the subdivision plat.

If central sewerage facilities are made available, those area proposed to be zoned Agricultural due to severe soils and slope limitations will be considered for rezoning to R-1.

COUNTY COUNCIL VOTES TO JOIN THE CHATTANOOGA AREA REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY (CARTA) UNDER CERTAIN CONDITIONS

On July 17, 1972, CARTA representatives requested a hearing before the County Council to present an urgent request that the Council join said group. On July 27th, 1972, Mr. Alfred Smith, Mr. Charles Mann and others, appeared and after a general discussion in depth, the Council took said request under advisement. Thereafter, on numerous occasions there was contact with different members of the Council, and Mr. Hugh Huffaker, Chairman, appeared before the Council this date to renew the request.

Judge Frost explained that under the present proposal for the County to join CARTA, the capital improvement cost as shown by Table 2 for Hamilton County would be \$9,536.00 per year and this sum was established; the estimated operating cost with expanded membership as shown by Table 4 would be some \$11,317.00 per year. He further noted under the proposed agreement at this time it provided the County could, after completion of five years of payments, if the Council so desired, give notice of withdrawal

by written notice to the Mayor of Chattanooga, and to the Mayor or presiding officer of each Participant, and that the County's obligations hereunder (capital & operating) will cease after one (1) more year's reimbursement payments, being a total of six (6) years.

While not particularly pleased with the makeup of the CARTA organization,

Judge Frost stated he felt there was a great need for an area transportation system, and
that a cooperative effort was possibly the wiser course for all governments in the area.

Thereupon, he made a motion that the County join CARTA under the Conditions set out herein, with the express right for the Council to withdraw as a participant in the manner
explained. Said motion was seconded by C. Wilson, and on a roll call vote, C. Mayfield,
C. Wilson, and Judge Frost voted "yes". C. Long and C. Newell voted "no". C. Newell
stated the reason he voted "no" was that all citizens of Hamilton County would not receive the service. Mr. Huffaker, promised that CARTA would provide the service to other
areas as soon as possible.

It is noted that possibly a formal resolution will be necessary at a later date with reference to this action.



# A RESOLUTION

TITLE TO AMEND A RESOLUTION ADOPTED BY THE HAMILTON COUNTY COUNCIL ON FEBRUARY 16, 1972, THAT ESTABLISHED A BOARD OF PLUMBING EXAMINERS FOR THE LICENSING OF QUALIFIED PLUMBING CONTRACTORS AND THOSE ENGAGED IN THE VARIOUS PHASES OF PLUMBING WORK WITHIN HAMILTON COUNTY; TO ESTABLISH EXAMINATION AND LICENSING FEES; TO REGULATE ACTIVITIES OF PERSONS LICENSED HEREUNDER; AND TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

Be it Resolved, by the County Council of Hamilton County, Tennessee, in Session Assembled:—

- 1. That Section 2 entitled "Same--Composition: Officers." as was adopted is hereby stricken, and in lieu thereof insert the following section, viz: "BE IT RESOLVED, That the Board of Plumbing Examiners for Hamilton County, Tennessee, will be composed of five persons to be appointed by the Hamilton County Council; two of whom shall be Master Employer Plumbers of not less than five years practical experience, one being a union employer and the other a non-union employer; and three of whom shall be Journeyman Plumbers of not less than five years practical experience, one of the three being a union member and one being a non-union plumber, and the third member may be either union or non-union."
  - 2. That Section 3 entitled "Same--Removal of members; quorum" be amended by removing the last sentence in the paragraph which reads, "In the event of a tie vote on any vote taken by the Plumbing Board, the matter may be referred to the County Engineer of Hamilton County who may cast the deciding vote".
  - 3. That Section 6 entitled "Application and Qualifications for examination and license" be stricken in its entirety, and in lieu therefore insert the following section, viz:

Qualifications for Class I Master Plumbing Contractor: Any person shall be eligible for written examination as a Class I Master Plumbing Contractor who (1) has had three (3) or more years' practical experience

as a journeyman plumber; or (2) has held an unrevoked Class I Master plumbing Contractor's license in the City of Chattanooga; or (3) has a professional license to practice engineering in the State of Tennessee; or (4) has had such education and experience in plumbing.

installation and maintenance or commercial, industrial or residential installations as shall be acceptable by the Board.

Note: The Class II Residential Plumbing Contractors Section is being eliminated and all those holding Class II Residential Plumbing Licenses will be granted Class I Licenses upon payment of fees.

Qualifications for Class III Journeyman Plumber: Any person shall be eligible for written examination as a journeyman plumber who (1) has had three (3) or more years practical experience as a registered apprentice plumber; or (2) has previously held an unrevoked journeyman plumber's license in the City of Chattanooga; or (3) has satisfactorily completed a recognized apprentice training program; or (4) has had such experience in plumbing as shall be acceptable to the Board.

Each applicant for examination by the Board shall file with the Building Commissioner's Office an application for such examination. Such applicant shall state the class of license applied for, the name and the proposed place of business of the applicant, or the name of the prospective employer of the applicant, and such other information as the Board shall require.

An examination fee in the following amount shall accompany the application which will be applied to first year license if applicant passes the examination:

Class I Master Plumbing Contractor \$25.00 Class III Journeyman Plumber 10.00

Note: Section 6(b) is being eliminated completely.

- 4. That Section 7(2) entitled "Plumbing licenses--Required, exceptions" be amended by striking thereform any reference to Class II Residential Plumbing License.
- 5. That Section 8 entitled "Same--Classes" be amended by eliminating the first paragraph and substituting therefor "Two classes of licenses and certificates shall be issued by the Board of Plumbing Examiners designated respectfully as Class I Master Plumbing Contractor's License, or as Class III Journeyman Plumber's License.

Said Section is further amended by striking therefrom the entire third paragraph dealing with Class II Residential Plumbing Contractor's . License.

6. That Section 9 entitled "Same--Fees" be stricken in its entirety and in lieu thereof insert the following, viz:

Fees for licenses granted or renewed under this Resolution shall be as follows:

For Class III, Journeyman Plumber's License and for each renewal thereof-----\$5.00 per year or part thereof.

Such fees shall be collected by the Building Commissioner's

Office and paid over to the County. All fees collected shall be used

along with other fees to pay the expenses of the Office of Building

Commissioner.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Resolution take effect from and after its passage, the public welfare requiring it.

#### REGULATION AMENDMENT

A RESOLUTION TO AMEND A REGULATION ENTITLED: "A REGULATION FOR AIR CONSERVATION AND THE PREVENTION; ABATEMENT AND CONTROL OF AIR POLLUTION; CREATING AN AIR POLLUTION CONTROL AUTHORITY AND PRESCRIBING ITS POWERS AND DUTIES; AND ESTABLISHING STANDARDS, RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE ABATEMENT AND CONTROL OF AIR POLLUTION AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF; AND PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE, SUSPENSION AND REVOCATION OF INSTALLATION PERMITS, TEMPORARY OPERATING PERMITS AND CERTIFICATES OF OPERATION; AND AUTHORIZING THE IMPOSITION AND COLLECTION OF PENALTIES AND FORFEITURES."

Be it Resolved by the County Council of Hamilton County,

Tennessee, That the Regulation above captioned be, and hereby is, amended
as follows:

SECTION 1. That the caption of the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking the period (.) at the end of the caption and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

"; AND REQUIRING MONITORING OF SOURCES AND MAKING EMISSION DATA AVAILABLE TO THE PUBLIC; AND PROVIDING FOR THE LICENSING OF OPERATORS OF CERTAIN TYPES OF EQUIPMENT."

SECTION 2. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking the first sentence of Paragraph 3 of Section 2-A and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

"The Board shall select annually a Chairman, Vice-Chairman and Secretary from among its members as officers; each officer shall have the right to vote on all matters, and shall hold office until the expiration of the term for which elected and thereafter until his successor has been elected."

SECTION 3. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking from Paragraph 1 of Section 3-A the language: "standards, rules and regulations consistent with the general intent and purposes of

this regulation to prevent, abate and control air pollution" and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

"provisions of this regulation".

SECTION 4. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking from Paragraph 3 of Section 3-A the language: "Through its Bureau, make" and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

"Make".

SECTION 5. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by adding immediately after the word "operation" in Paragraph 11 of Section 3-A the following:

"and other permits and licenses provided for in this regulation".

SECTION 6. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking from Section 4-B the fourth sentence in its entirety and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

"All action taken by the Board under this section shall be approved in writing by the chairman, vicechairman or chairman pro tem. of the Board."

SECTION 7. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by adding immediately following the language: "temporary operating permit" in the second sentence of Section 4-C the following:

"or any other permit or license issued pursuant to the provisions of this regulation".

SECTION 8. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking from the first sentence of Section 5-C the word: "shall" and substituting in lieu thereof the word:

"may"

by striking from the fourth sentence of Section 5-D the language: "sixty" and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

"thirty'(30)

SECTION 10. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by adding immediately following the word: "vice-chairman" in the first and fourth sentences of Section 7-B the following:

"or chairman pro tem."

SECTION 11. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking the fifth sentence of Section 7-B in its entirety and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

"Witnesses may likewise be examined by any member of the Board, the County Attorney, the attorney representing the Board, the attorney presenting proof from the Bureau, the applicant for variance or his attorney, an alleged violator or his attorney, or any other person determined by the Board to have a real and substantial interest in the hearing or his attorney."

SECTION 12. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking from the first sentence of Section 7-E the word "final"; and further by striking the fourth and fifth sentences of Section 7-E in their entirety and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

"Upon receipt of said notice of appeal and bond, the Director shall immediately notify the Chairman, Vice-Chairman or Chairman pro tem. of the Board of the appeal. The hearing on appeal to the Board may be had at a special meeting of the Board called by the Chairman, Vice-Chairman or Chairman pro tem. or at a regular meeting."

SECTION 13. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by adding to Section 8 as the concluding sentence thereof the following:

"Notwithstanding the foregoing, neither the composition of air contaminants nor emission data shall be considered confidential, under this section."

SECTION 14. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking Rule 2 of Section 9 in its entirety and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

#### "Rule 2. Regulation of Nitrogen Oxides

Rule 2.1. No person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit the emission of nitrogen oxides, expressed as nitrogen dioxide, from fuel burning equipment built or installed on and after the 1st day of January, 1973, in excess of the following:

- a. 165 ppm corrected to 15 percent excess air when gaseous fossil fuel is fired (equivalent to 0.20 pounds of nitrogen oxides, expressed as nitrogen dioxide, per million BTU heat input).
- b. 227 ppm corrected to 15 percent excess air when liquid fossil fuel is fired (equivalent to 0.30 pounds of nitrogen oxides, expressed as nitrogen dioxide, per million BTU heat input).
- c. 525 ppm corrected to 15 percent excess air when solid fossil fuel is fired (equivalent to 0.70 pounds of nitrogen oxides, expressed as nitrogen dioxide, per million BTU heat input).

When different fossil fuels are burned simultaneously in any combination, the applicable standard shall be determined by proration (i.e. the allowable emission, expressed as nitrogen dioxide, shall be equal to the value obtained from the equation:  $A = S \times (525) + L \times (227) + G \times (165)$  where

- L = fraction of total heat input derived from liquid fossil fuel
- G = fraction of total heat input derived from gaseous fossil fuel
- A = the emission limit in ppm

Rule 2.2. On and after the 1st day of July, 1975, no person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit the emission of nitrogen oxides from any nitric acid plant in being before the 1st day of January, 1973, in excess of 5.5 pounds (calculated as nitrogen dioxide) per ton of acid produced.

Rule 2.3. No person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit the emission of nitrogen oxides from any nitric acid plant built or installed on and after the 1st day of January, 1973, in excess of 3 pounds (calculated as nitrogen dioxide) per ton of acid produced.

Rule 2.4. All sampling of emissions from any source of nitrogen oxides and all analyses of samples to determine the amount of nitrogen oxides in such samples shall be conducted as specified by techniques promulgated by the Board."

"Rule 4.4. The Director or his representative may examine the weigh bills for all fuels delivered to and by all fossil fuel dealers by any means of transportation."

SECTION 16. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking from Rule 5.1. of Section 9 the language: "on or after the third anniversary of the adoption of the regulation" and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

"on and after the 14th day of October, 1972".

SECTION 17. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking Rule 6.3., Rule 6.4. and Rule 6.5. of Section 9 in their entirety and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

> "Rule 6.3. Open burning of vegetation and wood materials may be permitted by the Director provided the following conditions are met:

- a. A signed application shall be submitted to the Director giving the reasons why no other method of disposal can be employed, amount of material to be burned and location of material to be burned.
- No burning shall occur until such inspection of the material as may be required by the Bureau is conducted.
- Burning shall be conducted only on days of low pollution potential, as determined by the Bureau, and only between the hours of 9:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M. on such days.
- Only clean fuel not containing garbage, rubber, plastics or other refuse shall be allowed for the start-up of fires.
- Written approval is received from the Director.

Rule 6.4. Controlled burning of vegetation and wood materials may be permitted by the Director provided the following conditions are met:

- a. A signed application shall be submitted to the Director including the following:
  - Complete plans and details of the method and equipment to be used for the control of such burning.
  - 2. Name of the person in charge of the equipment and how he may be contacted.
- b. An annual fee of \$100.00 shall be included with the application, which fee shall be collected by the Bureau and remitted to the Fiscal Agent of the Board. Controlled burning permits are renewable annually. Application for renewal of a controlled burning permit shall be made in writing not less than sixty (60) days prior to the expiration of the permit for which renewal is sought.
- c. Written approval is received from the Director.

Rule 6.5. Open burning shall be allowed without compliance with Rule 6.3. only in the following specifically listed instances:

- a. Fires used for cooking of food or for ceremonial or recreational purposes, including barbecues and outdoor fireplaces, but only if such fires are fuelled for that particular purpose.
- b. Fires set by or at the direction of responsible fire control agencies for the prevention, elimination or reduction of the spread of existing fires.
- c. Safety flares and smokeless flares, except those for the combustion of waste gases. Flares for the combustion of waste gases shall comply with applicable provisions of Section 10 of this regulation."

SECTION 18. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended

by adding to Rule 6 of Section 9 as part thereof the following:

"Rule 6.6. Open burning may be permitted in the following instances, provided a written statement, such as is required in Rule 6.3.a. is filed with the Director and written approval is given by the Director:

- a. Fires set for the training and instruction of public or private fire fighting personnel, including those in civil defense.
- b. Other open burning where there is no other practical, safe and lawful method of disposal."

SECTION 19. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended

by striking Rule 7,3; of Section 9 in its entirety and substituting in lieu

"Rule 7.3. No person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit emission from any incinerator in being before the 1st day of January, 1973; in excess of 0.4 pounds per 100 pounds charge. No person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit emission from any incinerator built or installed on and after the 1st day of January, 1973, in excess of 0.1 pounds per 100 pounds charge. Provided, however, that on and after the 1st day of July, 1975, no person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit emission from any incinerator in excess of 0.1 pounds per 100 pounds charge".

SECTION 20. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking from Rule 7.4. of Section 9 the language: "effective date of this regulation" and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

"14th day of October, 1969".

SECTION 21. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking from Rule 7.5. of Section 9 the period (.) and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

"and a barometric damper."

SECTION 22. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by adding to Rule 7 of Section 9 as parts thereof the following:

"Rule 7.6. A pathological waste incinerator is one which has a solid hearth and which otherwise complies with the provisions of Rule 7.4. Any non-pathological waste incinerator in which pathological wastes are to be burned must have a solid hearth of sufficient size to accommodate such waste, which hearth must be located in such position that the waste can be placed opposite the flame port in the hottest part of the primary chamber. Unless the incinerator is specifically designed for the burning of pathological waste, no more than ten (10) percent of a charge shall consist of pathological waste.

Rule 7.7. On and after the 1st day of March, 1973, the person in responsible charge of the operation of an incinerator must be licensed by the Bureau. Such license shall be issued only after a passing score is received on a standardized test to be devised and administered by the Bureau. The Bureau shall test persons on their knowledge of the principles of incineration, including but not necessarily limited to the subjects of preignition, firing and cleaning. The Bureau shall have the power to collect a onetime fee of \$5.00 pursuant to the issuance of such license. Said fee shall be remitted to the Fiscal Agent of the Board. The Director shall have authority to suspend or revoke such license if the person holding such license willfully or by reason of incompetence violates any provision of this regulation. No license issued in accordance with the provisions of this Rule shall be assignable or transferrable. The failure to issue a license, or suspension or revocation of such license shall be an order or determination of the Director within the meaning of Section 7-E of this regulation."

SECTION 23. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking Rules 8.1. and 8.2. of Section 9 in their entirety and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

"Rule 8.1. All existing installations from which any air contaminant is emitted or escapes into open air as a result of the combustion of fuel shall comply with Schedule 1 of Table 1 and with the provisions of Rule 8.3. on and after the 14th day of October, 1972. Schedule 1 of Table 1 and the provisions of Rule 8.3. shall apply to all new fuel burning installations. Provided, however, that on and after the 1st day of July, 1974, the emission limits of Schedule 1 of Table 1 shall no longer be applicable and no person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit the emission of air contaminants from fuel burning equipment in being before the 1st day of January, 1973, in excess of that provided in Schedule 2 of Table 1.

Rule 8.2. No person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit the emission of air contaminants from fuel burning equipment built or installed on and after the 1st day of January, 1973, in excess of that provided in Schedule 3 of Table 1."

SECTION 24. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking from Rule 8.3. of Section 9 the second sentence thereof and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

The limitations, subject to linear interpolation, are to be conformed to when the fuel burning equipment is operating at the maximum design heat input rating.

by striking Table 1 of Rule 8 of Section 9 in its entirety and substituting in

SECTION 26. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking Rule 9 of Section 9 in its entirety and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

"Rule 9. Regulation of Visible Emissions from Internal Combustion Engines.

Rule 9.1. No person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit the emission of visible air contaminants from any spark ignition engine of ten (10) horsepower or more

- a. For a period of time exceeding ten (10) seconds, or
- b. After the vehicle has moved 100 yards or more from its initial starting point.

Rule 9.2. No person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit the visible emission of air contaminants from a diesel type engine for a period of more than sixty (60) consecutive seconds in excess of number one (1) of the Ringelmann Chart, or in excess of an opacity of twenty (20) percent.

Rule 9.3. Responsibility for compliance with Rules 9.1. and 9.2. applies to the owner, the registered owner, the lessee and the operator, individually, and each shall be jointly or severally liable for violation of these Rules and subject to the fines and penalties of this regulation.

Rule 9.4. Testing of vehicles to determine compliance with Rules 9.1. and 9.2. shall become a part of and be included in the semi-annual safety lane inspection required by Section 24-317 of the Chattanooga City Code (Code 1968).

Rule 9.5. Testing in the outdoor atmosphere of internal combustion engines which have been or are to be repaired will be allowed if such tests are performed on the premises of the repairing facility.

Rule 9.6. No motor vehicle which is equipped with a pollution control device shall be modified or altered in any manner which will decrease its efficiency or effectiveness in the control of air pollution.

Rule 9.7. No diesel engine which supplies motive power to a vehicle shall be allowed to idle more than five (5) consecutive minutes when the vehicle is not in motion, except when the vehicle is forced to remain motionless because of traffic conditions over which the operator has no control; provided, however, that any diesel engine which supplies motive power to a truck or locomotive shall be allowed to idle for more than five (5) consecutive minutes when it is at a distance in excess of five hundred (500) feet from the nearest residential, recreational, institutional, retail sales, hotel or educational premises."

SECTION 27. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking Rule 10.5. of Section 9 in its entirety and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

"Rule 10.5. Notwithstanding the provisions of Rule 10.2. and Rule 10.4., no person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit emission from any air contaminant source built or installed on and after the 1st day of January, 1973, in excess of that provided in Schedule 3 of Table 2 of Rule 10."

SECTION 28. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by adding to Rule 10 of Section 9 as part thereof the following:

"Rule 10.6. Tests to determine compliance with this Rule 10 shall be conducted as provided in Sections 10 and 14 of this regulation; provided, however, that compliance with this Rule 10 does not exempt such persons from the compliance with any other rule or section of this regulation applicable to emissions."

SECTION 29. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking Table 2 of Rule 10 of Section 9 in its entirety and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

SECTION 30. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by the designation of the first paragraph of Rule 11 of Section 9 as Rule 11.1. and by the designation of the second paragraph of Rule 11 of Section 9 as Rule 11.2.

SECTION 31. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking Rule 13 of Section 9 in its entirety and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

- "Rule 13.1. No person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit the emission of gas containing sulfur dioxide from any new source in excess of 500 ppm (volume).
- Rule 13.2. No person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit the emission of gas containing sulfur dioxide from any existing source in excess of 2,000 ppm (volume).
- Rule 13.3. On and after the 1st day of July, 1974, the provisions of Rule 13.2. above shall no longer be applicable and all air contaminant sources shall be construed as new sources for the purpose of Rule 13 of this regulation and shall be required to meet those standards set forth in Rule 13.1. above stated.
- Rule 13.4. Fuel burning equipment exhaust gas volume is to be corrected to thirty (30) percent excess air for purposes of determining sulfur dioxide concentration.
- Rule 13.5. All sampling of exhaust gases from any source of sulfur dioxide and all analyses of samples to determine the amount of sulfur dioxide in exhaust gases shall be conducted as specified by techniques promulgated by the Board.
- Rule 13.6. For the purposes of this Rule 13, all sulfur present in gaseous compounds and containing oxygen shall be deemed to be present as sulfur dioxide.
- Rule 13.7. Compliance with this Rule 13 shall not relieve a person from the requirements of Rule 12 or from the requirements of any other rules or provisions of this regulation."

SECTION 32. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended

by adding as Rule 15 of Section 9 thereof the following:

#### "Rule 15. Regulation of Asbestos

- Rule 15.1. No person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit emissions from any fabricating or manufacturing source involving the use of commercial asbestos except in accordance with the following:
  - a. Emissions of particulate matter, either from any such source continuously generating visible emissions, or in direct forced gas streams, shall not exceed the amounts which would be emitted if the air containing such visible emissions or if such forced exhausts

- (1) in fabric filter installations equipped with woven cotton fabrics having airflow permeabilities not exceeding 20 cfm/ft², utilizing no bypass devices and providing for emptying collection hoppers without creating visible emissions of particulate matter, or
- (2) where approved by the Director because of special process conditions, in wet collectors of the high-energy venturi type operated with a minimum gas pressure decrease across the venturi throat of 40 inches w.g.
- b. Visible emissions of particulate matter from any manufacturing or fabricating operations in an area directly open to the atmosphere are prohibited.
- Rule 15.2. No person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit the visible emission of asbestos particulate matter resulting from the repair or demolition of any building or structure; provided, however, that the provisions of this Rule shall not be applicable to the repair or demolition of a single-family dwelling.
- Rule 15.3. No person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit the spraying of any product which contains asbestos onto any portion of a building or structure.
- Rule 15.4. No person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit the spraying of any product which contains asbestos in an area directly open to the atmosphere.
- Rule 15.5. No person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit the emission of particulate matter from the spraying of any product which contains asbestos, if such spraying is not specifically prohibited by Rule 15.3. or 15.4., in excess of the amount which would be emitted if the air containing such emissions were treated
  - a. in fabric filter installations equipped with woven cotton fabrics having airflow permeabilities not exceeding 20 cfm/ft², utilizing no bypass devices and providing for emptying collection hoppers without creating visible emissions of particulate matter, or
  - b. where approved by the Director because of special process conditions, in wet collectors of the high-energy venturi type operated with a minimum gas pressure decrease across the venturi throat of 40 inches w.g.
- Rule 15.6. No person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit the surfacing or resurfacing of any roadway with any solid waste product of asbestos mining or milling operations which contains asbestos.
- Rule 15.7. The owner, operator or other person in responsible charge of an installation or operation which is the

source of asbestos emissions shall make available to the Director sufficient information as may be required to demonstrate that substitute equipment, other than the fabric filter installations or wet collectors specified in Rules 15.1. and 15.5., will provide the degree of control which, in the judgment of the Director, is at least as stringent as that which would be achieved by using such fabric filter installations or wet collectors. To the maximum extent practicable, the determination of equivalent degree of emission control will be based upon operation at the actual conditions at which the substitute equipment is or will be operated on the emission source. Factors which will be considered include, but are not limited to, collection efficiency, reliability, and maintenance practices associated with proper operation of the substitute equipment.

Rule 15.8. The owner, operator or other person in responsible charge of an installation or operation which is the source of asbestos emissions shall devise methods of estimating such emissions, submit such proposed estimating methods in writing to the Director and receive written approval from the Director for the use of such methods. Such person shall be responsible for submitting estimated emissions in writing to the Director at least every three (3) months."

SECTION 33. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by adding as Rule 16 of Section 9 thereof the following:

# "Rule 16. Regulation of Beryllium

Rule 16.1. No person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit total emissions from machine shops, ceramic plants, propellant plants, foundries, extraction plants, or incinerators designed or modified for disposal of toxic substances in excess of 10 grams of beryllium in a 24-hour period. For purposes of this Rule, "total emissions" means the emissions of beryllium in any form or any compound, from all points within a stationary source including emissions from the disposal of beryllium contaminated waste.

Rule 16.2. All beryllium emissions shall be transported through stacks or ducts which permit testing by standard stack sampling methods. The owner, operator or other person in responsible charge of an installation or operation which is the source of beryllium emissions shall conduct source tests at least every three (3) months and shall submit the results of such tests in writing to the Director."

SECTION 34. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking Paragraph 1 of Section 10-A in its entirety and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

"1. No person shall construct, install, reconstructor alter any fuel burning, refuse burning, process or

control equipment until an application; together with plans and specifications applicable to the work on the equipment and structures or buildings used in connection therewith, has been filed by the person or his agent in the office of, and has been approved by, the Director and an Installation Permit issued by him for such construction, installation or alteration.

SECTION 35. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking from the first sentence of Paragraph 2 of Section 10-A the language: ", including the means provided for admitting the air for combustion processes"; by also striking the language: "; the use to be made of such process, fuel burning, refuse burning or control equipment"; and by also striking the language: "physical characteristics of particulate emitted,".

SECTION 36. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking Paragraph 3 of Section 10-A in its entirety and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

"3. Maintenance or repair or physical transfer of any installed equipment within the premises of original installation which does not change the capacity of such process or control equipment, and which does not involve any change in the method of processing or increase the amount or alter the characteristics of the emission of air pollutants therefrom may be made without an Installation Permit. The physical transfer of any installed equipment to a location other than within the premises of original installation shall cause said equipment to be reclassified as "new equipment." "

SECTION 37. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking the third sentence of Paragraph 4 of Section 10-A in its entirety and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

"Said bond to be conditioned upon compliance
with this regulation and to provide for forfeiture upon
proof of a violation of any provision of this regulation by
the subject secret process; provided that proof of a violation of any provision of this regulation shall prima facie
create a presumption of fact that said violation was a violation by the subject secret process."

P. Personal Co.

SECTION 38. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking the first sentence of Paragraph 15 of Section 10-A in its entirety and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

"The following fee schedule shall apply to the issuance of all Installation Permits with the exception of those solely for control equipment, for which no fee is required. Said fees shall be collected by the Bureau and remitted to the Fiscal Agent of the Board."

SECTION 39. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking from Schedule 10-A-IV and from Schedule 10-A-V of Paragraph 15 of Section 10-A so much of the language as reads "\$40.00" and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

"\$15.00".

SECTION 40. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking Paragraph 4 of Section 10-B in its entirety and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

"4. A Temporary Operating Permit shall be valid for not in excess of six (6) months after the date of issue. Extensions of time not in excess of three (3) months may be granted by the Director. Upon the expiration of such Permit or of such extensions as may be granted, application for a Certificate of Operation must be made as is hereinafter provided."

SECTION 41. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking Paragraph 5 of Section 10-B in its entirety, including Schedule 10-B-I through 10-B-V, and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

"5. A fee of \$15.00 will be assessed for the issuance of each Temporary Operating Permit, and for each extension thereof should an extension be granted, which fee shall be collected by the Bureau and remitted to the Fiscal Agent of the Board. No fee shall be required for permits upon control equipment."

SECTION 42. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking the second sentence of Paragraph (1) of Section 10-C in its entirety and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

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"Said Certificate of Operation shall be kept on file at and made available to Bureau representatives upon request."

by striking from the end of Paragraph (3) of Section 10-C the period (.) and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

", and no person shall operate any equipment which requires a Certificate of Operation until such Certificate shall have been obtained. No person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit the operation of any equipment which requires a Certificate of Operation until such Certificate shall have been obtained. No person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit the operation of any equipment which requires a Certificate of Operation if a previously issued Certificate of Operation has been suspended or revoked."

SECTION 44. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by renumbering Paragraph (4) of Section 10-C as Paragraph (5) of Section 10-C, and by the adding as Paragraph (4) of Section 10-C the following:

"(4) The Director shall have authority to require owners, operators or persons in responsible charge of stationary sources to install, maintain and use emission monitoring devices and to make periodic reports to the Director on the nature and amounts of emissions from such stationary sources. The Director shall have authority to make such data available to the public as reported and as correlated with any applicable emission standards or limitations."

SECTION 45. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking from Schedule 10-C-IX and from Schedule 10-C-X of Paragraph (4) of Section 10-C so much of the language as reads: "\$25.00" and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

"\$15.00"

SECTION 46. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking Section 10-D in its entirety.

SECTION 47. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by adding immediately preceding the word; "Operating" in Paragraph (2) of Section 10-E the word:

"Temporary"

SECTION 48. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended

by adding to Section 10-E as parts thereof the following:

- "(8) Any equipment which can be classified as a minor pollution source shall be exempted from the requirements of Sections 10-A and 10-B, but must have a Certificate of Operation. No person shall operate any such equipment until an application for a Certificate of Operation, together with plans and specifications of the equipment, has been filed by such person and a Certificate of Operation has been issued by the Director. An annual fee of \$5.00 shall be assessed for the issuance of a Certificate of Operation upon such equipment.
- (9) Unless otherwise specified in this regulation all measurements or calculations of stack emission concentrations shall be corrected to the minimum amounts of air and water vapor which are necessary for the process operation. Such measurements or calculations shall be corrected to a standard temperature of seventy (70) degrees Fahrenheit and a standard pressure of seven hundred sixty (760) millimeters of mercury. All water vapor shall be treated as a perfect gas."

SECTION 49. That the Regulation be, and hereby is, amended by striking Section 16 in its entirety and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

#### "Sec. 16. Definitions.

In the interpretation and enforcement of this regulation, the following definitions shall apply:

- 1. Air contaminant Any smoke, soot, fly ash, dust, cinders, dirt, noxious or obnoxious acids, fumes, oxides, gases, vapors, odors, toxic or radioactive substance, waste, particulate, solid, liquid or gaseous matter, or any other materials in the outdoor atmosphere, but excluding uncombined water.
- 2. <u>Air flow permeability</u> The volumetric rate of air flow in cfm, produced by a pressure decrease of 0.5 in. w.g. across a new, clean filtering fabric, divided by the area of the fabric in ft². The test air stream is maintained at nominal atmospheric pressure and temperature.
- 3. Air pollution The presence in the outdoor atmosphere of one or more air contaminants or combinations thereof in such quantities and of such duration that they are or may tend to be injurious to human, plant, or animal life, or property, or that interfere with the comfortable enjoyment of life or property or the conduct of business.
- 4. Asbestos Any of six (6) naturally occurring, hydrated mineral silicates: Actinolite, amosite, anthophyllite, chrysotile, crocidolite, and tremolite.
- 5. Board The Chattanooga-Hamilton County Air Pollution Control Board as recognized and/or created by this regulation.

- 6. Bureau The Bureau of Air Pollution Control as recognized and/or established by this regulation.
- 7. Control equipment Any item of equipment used to eliminate or reduce the emission of an air contaminant.
- 8. Controlled burning Open burning conducted in such manner or with the aid of such special equipment that emissions are reduced.
- 9. Director The Director of the Bureau.
- 10. <u>Dry basis</u> The method of reporting coal analysis with moisture eliminated and remaining constituents recalculated to total 100 percent.
- 11. Dwelling unit Any room or group of rooms located within a dwelling and forming a single habitable unit with facilities which are used or intended to be used for living, cooking, sleeping and eating.
- 12. <u>Emission</u> A release into the outdoor atmosphere of air contaminants.
- 13. Emission point That place where emission occurs.
- 14. Excess air Air entering a combustion chamber in excess of the amount theoretically required to complete combustion of materials in the combustion chamber.
- 15. Existing Things, such as equipment, machines, devices, articles, contrivances or installations which were in being before the 14th day of October, 1969. If any such existing equipment, machine, device, article, contrivance or installation is altered, repaired or rebuilt so that potential air pollutant emission is increased, it shall be reclassified as "new", as defined in this regulation.
- 16. Fly ash Particulate matter capable of being gas or air borne, consisting essentially of fused ash and/or burned or unburned materials resulting from combustion of fuel or refuse.
- 17. Fossil fuel Coal, coke and liquid petroleum fuels other than gasoline, diesel fuels and kerosene.
- 18. Fuel burning equipment Any equipment, device or contrivance used for the burning of any fuel (except refuse) and all appurtenances thereto, including ducts, breechings, fly ash collecting equipment, fuel feeding equipment, ash removal equipment, combustion controls, stacks, chimneys, etc., used for indirect heating in which the material being heated is not contacted by, and adds no substance to, the products of combustion. Such equipment includes, but is not limited to, that used for heating water to boiling; raising steam or superheating steam; heating air as in warm air furnaces; furnishing process heat that is conducted through process vessel walls; and furnishing process heat indirectly through its transfer by

- 19. Fugitive dust Particulate matter emitted from any source other than a flue or stack.
- 20. Hand fired fuel burning equipment Fuel burning equipment in which fresh fuel is manually introduced directly into the combustion chamber.
- 21. <u>Incinerator</u> Refuse burning equipment as is hereinafter defined.
- 22. Internal combustion engine Any engine of 10 horsepower as rated by S. A. E. methods or larger in which the combustion of gaseous, liquid or pulverized solid fuel takes place.
- 23. Mechanical fuel burning equipment Fuel burning equipment incorporating means by which fuel is mechanically introduced into the combustion chamber.
- 24. Minor pollution source Any fuel burning, refuse burning or process equipment which, without control equipment, would emit less than 1,000 pounds per year and less than ten (10) pounds per day of air contaminants, and which can otherwise be operated in compliance with this regulation; provided that this definition shall not be applicable to sources of asbestos or beryllium emissions.
- 25. Multiple chamber incinerator Any article, machine, equipment, contrivance, structure or part of a structure used to dispose of combustible refuse by burning, consisting of three or more refractory lined combustion furnaces in series, physically separated by refractory walls, interconnected by gas passage ports or ducts and employing adequate design parameters necessary for maximum combustion of the material to be burned.
- 26. New Things, such as equipment, machines, devices, articles, contrivances or installations built or installed on or after the 14th day of October, 1969, and things or installations existing at said stated time which are later altered, repaired or rebuilt so that potential air pollutant emission is increased.
- 27. Opacity That property of a substance tending to obscure vision and is measured in terms of per cent obscuration. As used in this regulation, it does not include obscuration of vision due to uncombined water droplets. The percentage opacity of a plume is numerically equal to twenty (20) times the Ringelmann number for a plume of black smoke having equivalent capacity of obscuration.
- 28. Open burning Unconfined burning of combustible material where no equipment has been provided and used for control of air.
- 29. Particulate matter Material other than uncombined water, which is suspended in air or other gases, in a finely divided form, as a liquid or solid.

- 30. Pathological waste All, or parts of forgans, bones, muscles, other tissues and organic wastes of human or animal origin, laboratory cultures, and infective dressings and other similar material.
- 31. Person Any individual, partnership, co-partnership, firm, company, corporation, association, joint stock company, trust, estate, governmental entity or any other legal entity, or their legal representatives, agents or assigns. The masculine gender shall include the feminine, the singular shall include the plural where indicated by the context.
- 32. <u>Ppm</u> Parts per million by volume at a temperature of seventy (70) degrees Fahrenheit and at a pressure of seven hundred sixty (760) millimeters of mercury.
- 33. Process air Air used principally as a function of the process.
- 34. Process emission Any emission of an air contaminant to the ambient air other than that from fuel burning equipment, incinerator or open burning.
- 35. Process equipment Any equipment, device or contrivance for changing any materials whatever or for storage or handling of any materials, the use or existence of which may cause any discharge of air contaminants into the open air but not including that equipment specifically defined as "Fuel Burning Equipment" or "Refuse Burning Equipment," in this regulation.
- 36. Process weight The total weight of all materials introduced into any specific process which process may cause any discharge of air contaminant. Solid fuels charged will be considered as part of process weight, but liquid and gaseous fuels and combustion and process air will not. For a cyclical or batch operation, the process weight per hour will be derived by dividing the total process weight by the number of hours in one complete operation from the beginning of any given process to the completion thereof, excluding any time during which the equipment is idle. For a continuous operation, the process weight per hour will be derived by dividing the process weight for a 24-hour period by 24.
- 37. Refuse burning equipment Any equipment, device or contrivance used for the destruction of garbage and/or other combustible wastes by burning, and all appurtenances thereto.
- 38. Ringelmann Smoke Chart The Chart published in the U.S. Bureau of Mines Information Circular 7718, for use in measuring the shades, density or opacity of air contaminants arising from stacks and other sources.
- 39. Salvage operation Any operation conducted in whole or in part for the salvage or reclaiming of any product or material.
- 40. Smoke Small gas or airborne particles resulting from combustion operations and consisting of carbon and ash and other matter and present in sufficient quantity to be observable.

- 41. Source Any equipment, process or operation which causes or contributes to cause emission at an emission point or any combination of items of equipment, processes or operations which when combined cause emission at an emission point.
- 42. Standard conditions 14.7 psia and a temperature of 70° F.
- 43. Surface-burning type of fuel burning equipment Fuel burning equipment in which fresh fuel is fired on top of the hot fuel bed.
- 44. Suspended particulates Particulate matter which will remain suspended in air for an appreciable period of time.
- 45. Volatile matter Those constituents of coal given off as gas or vapor, as determined by methods described by the American Society for Testing Materials. (D271-33)
- Washing The process of purifying, cleaning or removing impurities from coal by mechanical processes, regardless of the cleaning medium used."

SECTION 50. That the Regulation, as previously adopted and amended, and as is here amended, be construed to be cumulative in its effect, and it is here declared to be the legislative intent that compliance with any one or more provisions of the Regulation or rules thereof shall not be construed as a defense for non-compliance with any other applicable provisions of the Regulation or rules thereof.

SECTION 51. That the Regulation as is here amended shall take effect two weeks from and after its passage, the public welfare requiring it. The passage of this Resolution shall in no way postpone or delay those actions required of persons subject to the Regulation, nor shall the passage of this amending Resolution operate as a postponement of the effective date of the Regulation which is here amended.

SECTION 52. If any section, part of a section, sentence, clause or phrase of the Regulation or of this Resolution is for any reason declared to be unconstitutional or otherwise invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of any other portion of the Regulation or of this Resolution, and only such invalid portion shall be elided.
