RESOLUTION ON THE DEATH OF THE HONORABLE WILEY COUCH. 1888--1947.
To The County Court of Hamilton County, Tennessee.at its session held on May 5 th 1947.
Your Memorial Committee, appointed by the County Judge Pro Tem at your last meeting, begs to submit the following on the passing of County Judge Wiley 0. Couch, who died on April 4 th 1947, at his home on Duane Road in Chattanooga, Tennessee, His death came after a valiant but futile fight against ill health, which developed in mid-November of 1946. It came in spite of the fact that he sought and obtained the services of the country's foremost doctors. His malady developed so rapidly that it was necessary for him to tender his resignation as County Judge two weeks prior to his death.

Judge Couch was born on the 4 th day of March, 1888 , on his father's farm on the Tennessee River at Bean Rock, a small community near Guntersville, Alabama. He lived the life of a farmer boy and received his education at the nearby Albertville (Alabama) Agricultural College.

His father was a Confederate veteran, and even in his early life he absorbed from him a loyalty to the Democratic party which never wavered or $f$ altered until his death.

As a lad of seventeen he came to Chattanooga where he was first employed by E. R. Betterton, Sr., for whom he worked for ten years. or more.

Shortly after war was declared with Germany in April, 1917, he entered the United States Army. He was assigned to a chemical warfare company, which was attached to the famous First Division of the American Expeditionary Forces, where he saw active service against the emeny with this outstanding unit of America's first army to see action on Euporean soil in the history of this nation. After the Armitice was signed he served for a while with the Army of Occupltion in Germany and was stationed near Coblenz. He was discharged May 1919.

Upon his return to his old home be began, and constantly maintained thereafter, his close association with his comrades in arms. Most of his closest friends were men who had seen service in the armed forces of the United States in World War l. He was active in American Legion, and soon became one of its leaders and was Commander of the Davis King Summers Post of the Legion in 1930.,

Judge Couch was a man of remarkable business ability; Shortly after his return from France he and his brother, the late W. H. Couch, bought the Kelly Cigar and Tobacco Company. In a femarkably short period of time this eompany dominated the wholesale tobacco business in this comminuty. He retained his inneerest in this company until his death, and at his death his sister, Mrs. Grace Holley, was a part owner. In 1927 he and George Jones bought from the Cash-Melton Hardware Co., the Chevrolet automobile business, which they operated with pronounced success until the business was sold to other parties shortly before the depression of 1932. He was interested in various pther businesses, particularly the Radio Sales Company. His associates in this successful enterprise at the time of his death were his close friends, E. R. Betterton, recently Mayor of Chattanooga, Joe Richardson, County Trustee and J. E. Kunz.

It would be difficult to estimate the number of persons in $t$ he business world in Chattanoga,
who are indebted to Judge Couch for giving them an opportunity to start in business In many instances he would finance their original venture, and at all times In many instances he would finance their original venture, and at all times he gave to them his advice and encouragement.

In 1932 he first entered policitcs actively as a candidate for office. He was elected County Trustee without opposition and was twice re-elected without opposition. After his last term of office expired he returned to the active management of his business interests. He ee-entered politics in 1941 as a member of the County Council, the Legislature meeting in that year having created this council to take over the administrative functions of the old County Court. In 1942 he announced as a candidate for County Judge against Judge Will Cummings, and in a spirited campaign was elected to this office. Since then, and until his death, he was the dominent political figure in Hamilton County, as we well as the Third Congressional District. He also exercised great influence in the politics of the State of Tennessee. Many men holding both State and Federal positions owe these positions laregely to the support of Judge Couch.

He made an outstanding record as County Judge. He bought James W. Gentry to this county as County Manager. The affairs of the county were handled during his administration strictly on a business basis. During his administration the bonded debt of the countly was reduced by a million dollars, a surplus of approximately a million dollars was accumulated in the County Treasury and the county tax rate was reduced eight cents. In spite of this the schools, institutions, and highways and other county functions were maintained at a high level of efficiency. Extravagence and waste was largely eliminated. He demanded and obtained from the county employees an honest day's work in return for an honest day's work.

In spite of his many business and political activities he maintained an active interest in the civic affairs of the city and county. He was a Thirty-second Degree Mason, a past potentate of the Shrine, a member of the Knights of Pythias and the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks. He was an active and faithful member of the Centenary Methodist Church.

In 1915 he married Miss Mabel Bradfield of Hot Springs, Arkansas, who survived him. He was also survived by his sister, Mrs. Grace Holley, his brother, Dr. E. H. (Zeke) Couch, of Gunterville, Alabama, three nieces, Mre. Maxine Couch Davis of Guntersville, Miss Wilda Couch of Guhtersville, and "rs. Jeff Smith of Huntsville, and three nephews, Jack Holley of Chattanooga, and Robert and Owen Couch of Guntersville.

Judge Couch possessed literally a host of friends. Rarely, if ever before, have so many people paid tribute to the death of a citizen as they did to him on the occasion of his funeral. By nature he was a kindly and generous man, and attracted friends naturally. He was a loyal and devoted friend, an attentative and loving husband, a business. man of honor and ability a public servant of the highest order, and last, and more important than all, a Christian gentleman.

Premises considered, therefore;
(1) That the County Court of Hamilton County deplores the passing of Wiley 0 . Couch, and recognizes that in his going the County has lost one of its ablest citizens, and this Court a splendid leader.
(2) That the esteem in his he was universilly held and the affectionate regard of the members of the Court for him causes each member to feel a personal loss in his death.
(3) That the court extends deep sympathy to his widow, his brother and sister, and other members of his family in their bereavement.
(4) That a copy of this memorial be spread upon the minutes of the County Court
of "amilton County, and copy be furnished to the press of Chattanooga.

WHEREAS, as the cost of welfare increases all counties are in danger of having the welfare requirements withheld from county road funds; and

WHEREAS, Hamilton County will be relieved of this expensive program if the State of

Tennessee will assume the entire obligation and administration of the Welfare Department.

We have also completed the Sawyer School and the old building has been abandoned, In several schools, where additions are being built, classes are being conducted in improvised rooms.

Another item of importance to the Department of Dducation is included under Capital Cutlar in the amount of \(\$ 51,000,00\). This is necessary in order to match Federal money which will be made available through the National Defense Act of 1958.

SCHOOL TRANSPORTATION BUDGET - The Familton County Board of Dducation in adjourned session March 31, 1959 approved a tentative transportation budget for 1959-60 in the amount of \$379, 383, 55. This will necessitate an increase of approximately \(\$ 32,000,00\) above the budget for the current school year, however, I wish to point out that two items included in the proposed budget were taken out of the transportation budget during the current year and paid from the school funds and they are now being transferred to the transportation budget, where they belong. This budget does not include any increase for the bus drivers.

I am happy to report that our building program is progressing nicely and within the next sixty days we hope to have all of the projects, which are a part of the present \(\$ 4,500,000\) available to the county schools, under construction. This program is being made possible as a result of the Referendum approved by the voters of Hamilton County in 1958 and the authorization of the Hamilton County Council in June 1958.

I am grateful to you for your cooperative spirit and the interest you have shown in our schools and truat that we continue to serve you even better in the future than we have in the past.

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was elected County Register in which post he served until 1947, when the County Court elect@d him County Judge. In 1940 he was elected in a county-wide election to serve out the remain ing two years of that term. Judge Thrasher, a democrat, won re-election in 1950 and in 2958, where has was serving at his untimely death.

WHEREAS, deceased was borm on June 14, 1893, in Chattanooga, Tennessee, and after receiving his early educational training in the local schools of the county, he graduated from the Knoxville College of Law in 1924, immediately returning to Chattanooga and entering public service.

WHEREAS, through persistent effort, tact and ability these are the things that Judge Thrasher has accomplished to his death for the people of Hamilton County and the Gity of Chattanooga, He succeeded and instituted the Reeves Taxation Plan; he secured a double "A" Bond rating for Hamilton County; he was instrumental in securing new industry. Judge Thrasher was the leader in securing the bridge across Chickamauga Dam, which the 1955 Legislature named the Wilkes T. Thrasher Bridge. State-wide he was active in politics and headed the Tennessee County Service Association made up of County Judges in the State of Tennessee. He initiated a modern accounting system, and worked untirely to secure the new mental hospital on Moccasin Bend. Since 1958, six and one-half million dollars has been spent on the Hamilton \(\underset{C}{\text { çounty }}\) school building program under his watchful eye.

WHEREAS, he gave unstintingly and graciously of his time and money for civic betterment whether of a charitable, religious or public nature, inentified himself with all moral movements for the uplist and improvement of his community, state and nation, always loyal and faithful to his church and its activities, an interested and active member of several civic clubs having for their public mission and general upbuilding, improvement and betterment of conditions and affairs, always standing for those things that make life better, happier and sweeter -- for churches and schools, for law and order and all other things that add to the spiritual values of life, and one thing that he prided himself in was restoring baseball to Chattanooga. The durable Courthouse warrior was one of five incorporators of the Youth Foundation which raised money for restoring the Lookouts.

Judge Thrasher was a member of the following organizations of our City and County. A member of the Masons, Scottish Rite, Alhambra Shrine, Royal Order of Jesters, Elks Club, Eagles Club, Moose Club, American Legion and V.F.W. He was a member of the Central Presbyterian Church.

The County Judge is survived by his wife, Mrs. Wilkes T. Thrasher, a son, Attorney Wilkes T. Thrasher, Jr., a daughter, Mrs. Ralph Baldwin, and two grandsons, Wilkes T. Thrasher, III, and James Pratt Thrasher, two brothers, Paul and Eugene Thrasher of Chattanooga, and four sisters, Mrs. Ruth Murphy, Mrs. Maggie Burgess, Mrs. Heiskell Whitaker and Mrs. Irma Keith.

His father was widely known in political circles and was, at one time, Purchasing Agent for the State of Tennessee. Tom received his education in Shelbyville, Tennessee at Brandon Training School. After movingto Chattanooga, he became a member of the Chattanooga Fire Department and was retired from the Department with the rank of Gaptain as the result of injuries suffered in extinguishing a fire at the Kenton Shoe Hospital in 1940 .

Mr. Curtis was a member of the First Presbyterian Church of Shelbyville, Chattanooga, Lodge 91, of the Elks, where he was serving as a Trustee, Temple Lodge 430 F. \& A. M. and Alhambra Shrine.

BE it Resolved, by the Quarterly County Court of Hamilton County, Tennessee, in Session Assembled:--

SECTION 1. As authorized by Chapter 329, Public Acts of 1963, there is levied a tax in the same manner and on the same privileges subject to the "Retailers' Sales Tav Act" under Chapter 30, Title 67, Tennessee Code Annotated, as the same may be amended, which are exercised in Hamilton County. The tay is levied on all such privileges at a rate of one-third (1/3) of the rates levied in the Retailers' Sales Tax Act codified in Chapter 30 , Title 67 , Tennessee Code Annotated. Provided the tax shall not exceed $\$ 5.00$ on the sale or use of any single article of personal property, and there is excepted from the tax levied by this resolution the sale, purchase, use, consumption or distribution of electric power or energy, natural or artificial gas and coal and fuel oil. Penalties and interest for delinquencies shall be the same as provided in Section 67-3026, TCA.

SECTION 2. If a majority of those voting in the election required by section 5 of Chapter 329, Public Acts of 1963, vote for the resolution, collection of the tax levied by this resolution shall begin on the first day of the month occurring 30 or more days after the County Election Commission makes its official canvass of the election returns.

SECTION 3. It having been determined by the Department of Revenue of the State of Tennessee that it is feasible for this tax to be collected by that Department, said determination being evidenced by sales and use tax rule and regulafion No. heretofore promulgated by the Department of Revenue, the Department shall collect such tax concurrently with the collection of the state tax in the same manner as the state tay is collected in accordance with rules and regulations promulgated by said Department. The County Judge is hereby authorized to contract with Department of Revenue for the collection of the tax by the Department, and to provide in said contract the Department may deduct from the tay collected a reasonable amount or percentage to cover the expense of the administration and collection of said tax.

SECTION 4. In the event the tar is collected by the Department of Revenue, suits for the recovery of any tax illegally assessed or collected shall be brought against the County Trustee.

SECTION 5. A COPY of this resolution shall be transmitted to the said Department of Revenue and shall be published one time in a newspaper of general circulation in Hamilton County prior to the election called for in Section 2 hereof.
