- 1. Registration deadline for mailed-in applications is postmarked by September 10, 2010. Online registration deadline is September 13<sup>th</sup>. All entries must be pre-registered.**
2. All items must be checked in at the Chester Frost Park Pavilion on Thursday, September 23, 2010 between 2:00 and 6:00 p.m. to be eligible for judging.
3. All items must be picked up on Sunday, September 26, 2010 between 5:00 and 8:00 p.m.  
*Vehicles will not be permitted into the fairground area until 7:00 due to pedestrian and bus traffic.*
4. The Fair Committee will remove all items not claimed by 8:00 p.m. *All entrants must have claim tickets to claim items. The County Fair is not responsible for lost, stolen, or spoiled goods.*
5. Divisions I - III are open to youth (6-18 years of age) and adults (19 and up), Legos and building toys and Division IV (photography) is youth only.
6. Adult and youth lots will be judged separately. Youth is divided into two age groups; Youth A (6-11) and Youth B (12-18).
7. All winners will receive ribbons and premiums as follows:  
1<sup>st</sup> - \$5      2<sup>nd</sup> - \$4      3<sup>rd</sup> - \$3
8. All items must have been produced by entrant within the last 12 months.
9. All painting, photography, or drawing entries must be entered in a frame suitable for hanging. All clothing must be on a wire hanger. Please read each division carefully for further instructions.  
*Items not properly submitted will not be accepted.*
10. Participants may enter only one item per class, but may enter as many classes as desired.

### **Division II – Baked Goods**

**Please read carefully – new rules applied in this category**  
**Appearance** - Uniform browning and color, originality.

**Texture** - Lightness and evenness of grain, moistness, tenderness and flavor

**Recipes must be included. All entries must be presented in sealed clear plastic (bakery style), disposable plastic containers, or zip-lock bags. Decorated cakes are exempt but must be completely sealed in clear plastic. Entries deemed unfit for judging such as unsealed items, cakes in pans, on china, glass or plastic plates or items which contain perishable items such as fruit that spoils quickly will not be accepted for entry.**

#### **Classes**

1. Pies – ½ of pie
2. Candies (four)
3. Quick Breads (cornbread, banana bread) – ½ of a loaf
4. Muffins or biscuits – four
5. Cakes (decorated or frosted)

***Decorated Cakes will be judged on appearance and originality and will not be tasted.***

6. Cakes – no icing (pound, etc.) – ½ of a loaf or cake
7. Yeast Breads or Rolls – 4
8. Sweet Breads or Rolls – 4
9. Cookies (squares or bars) – 4
10. Other Cookies – 4
11. Healthy Baked Goods  
(reduced fat, low cholesterol, etc.) – ½ of a loaf or 4

### **Division III – Clothing**

**Appearance** Design (suitability, pleasing, interesting), color combination, originality, texture combination, cleanliness, pressing, use of accessories.

**Workmanship** Correct grain, choice and neatness of seams, hems, and finish, stitches.

***All clothing must be displayed on a wire hanger***
