#### Linking Students and Wildlife

Project WILD links students and wildlife through its mission to provide wildlife-based conservation and environmental education that fosters responsible actions toward wildlife and related natural resources. Through the use of balanced curriculum materials and professional training workshops, Project WILD accomplishes its goal of developing awareness, knowledge, skills, and commitment. This results in the making of informed decisions, responsible behavior, and constructive action concerning wildlife and the environment.

#### Project WILD Activities

The activities found in Project WILD instructional materials are intended for use in both classroom and informal settings and are designed to support state and national academic standards appropriate for grades K-12. The activities can easily be adapted to meet the learning requirements for academic disciplines ranging from science and environmental education to social studies, math, and language arts. Educators may choose one or more Project WILD activities to teach a concept or skill. The activities may be integrated into existing courses of study, or an entire set of activities may serve effectively as the basis for a specific course.

In consideration of being permitted to participate in this voluntary program sponsored by "Project WILD", the Releasor, for himself/herself, his/her spouse, legal representatives, heirs, and assigns, hereby releases, waives and discharges "Project WILD", Hamilton County, Tennessee, and/or Hamilton County Water Quality Program, Bradley County, Tennessee and/or Bradley County Stormwater Program, the City of Cleveland, Tennessee, the City of Cleveland Stormwater Program and/or the Tennessee Aquarium, their officers and members, agents, employees, and Commissioners, owners and lessees of the premises and each of them, their officers and employees, referred to as Releasees, from all liability to the Releasor, his/her spouse, legal representatives, heirs and assigns, for any and all loss or damage, and any claim or damages resulting therefrom on account of any injury or death to Releasor's whether caused by the negligence of Releasees or otherwise while the Releasor is participating in this project or for any purpose using the property of Hamilton County, Tennessee including from any and all claims arising relative to transportation to, during and from event or while entering or leaving the premises during this project.

Releasor attest that he/she had read the attached information document briefly describing the activities involved and understands and acknowledges that he/she is physically able to participate without a risk of harm. Further, Releasor acknowledges that his/her participation in the project is totally voluntary.
