Chairman Smedley read a statement into the record waving the Commission's Rules of Order, which require a motion and second in order to discuss any Resolution. It was noted per Resolution No. 419-14, adopted on April 3, 2019, any Resolution that would result in an increase to the certified tax rate would require discussion at two separate, sequential, and regularly scheduled meetings prior to a vote being taken. Therefore, Resolution Nos. 619-14 and 619-15 were introduced for discussion only and will not be voted on until June 26, 2019.

BUDGET PRESENTATION

Mayor Coppinger began today's budget presentation by thanking staff members and administrators for their hard work and assistance in putting together the fiscal year 2019-2020 budget. He also expressed his appreciation to members of the Commission

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for their participation and input during the three budget workshops held at the McDaniel Building. He noted the proposed budget is available for viewing on the Hamilton County website. He stated a legal notice will be provided to the Times Free Press in order to fulfill the required 10-day public notice.

Mayor Coppinger presented the budget in detail stating it was a balanced budget of \$819,187,740, which will require a 34-cent property tax increase for education. It was noted there was no property tax increase for county general government. The proposed budget is \$65,256,000 larger than the fiscal year 2018-2019 budget, which represents an 8.7 percent increase. Mayor Coppinger noted 61 percent of the budget is going to school spending. The Department of Education proposed a \$443 million general-purpose budget, which reflects a \$60 million increase over the 2019-2020 budget, and represents a 13.6 percent increase. The \$60 million increase includes \$34 million for the county that would be funded by the 34-cent property tax increase with the remainder coming from state and federal funding. It was noted the increase would provide raises of 5 percent for teachers and 4 percent for classified staff.

Mayor Coppinger reported the general fund portion of the budget is \$261 million, which is an \$8.1 million, or 3.2 percent, increase over last year's budget. He noted the increase is primarily to fund employee salary increases of 2.5 percent (5 percent for sworn Sheriff's deputies) and 55 additional full-time employees, 45 of which are in public safety. It was noted 14% of the budget is going towards public safety. He

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reported the Sheriff's Department budget is \$59,065,000, which is a \$3.5 million, or 6.4 percent, increase from last year. He explained this increase will provide 6 new positions, assist in funding the FUSE mental health program, and provide 5 percent raises to sworn personnel as well as allow additional compensation to address the wage compression.

Additional topics discussed included growth in property taxes, which totaled \$3.9 million, or 2.2 percent. Sales tax increased by \$1.5 million and the state gas tax increased by \$311,000.

40:01 In response to Chairman Smedley's question, Attorney Taylor stated in the event the budget was not adopted a new 21-day discussion period would not be needed.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Chairman Smedley asked for announcements from members of the Commission.

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42:05 Commissioner Martin announced a community meeting on June 6, 2019 at 6:00 PM at Stuart Heights Baptist Church in Hixson to discuss the proposed budget.

42:28 Commissioner Mackey spoke about the 75th anniversary of D-Day and the freedoms afforded to Americans because of those who fought. He voiced his support of the proposed budget.

46:16 Commissioner Sharpe commended the Mayor and his staff for their work and voiced his support for the proposed budget. He emphasized his support for public education, student achievement, and economic growth.

47:28 Commissioner Boyd commended Mayor Copping and staff for their work on the budget. He voiced his opposition to Department of Education's proposed budget. He stated a majority of his constituents do not support a tax increase and played a recording of a voice message he received from one of his constituents opposing the increase. Commissioner Boyd noted he does support raises for classroom teachers.

55:06 Commissioner Geter thanked Mayor Copping and staff for their work on the budget. She reported public education and public safety are both very important issues to her and voiced her support for the proposed budget. She encouraged everyone to remain open throughout budget discussions.

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1:01:35 Commissioner Fairbanks thanked the citizens of Soddy Daisy who attended the community meeting in his district last night to discuss the proposed budget. He agreed there is a need for public safety services and commended the Finance staff for addressing those concerns without an adverse impact on other departments.

1:03:22 Commissioner Baker also commended Mayor Coppinger and staff for their work. He reported he has had several meetings regarding the proposed budget as well and will take information from all sides into consideration.

1:04:47 Mayor Coppinger clarified that any investor operating under a PILOT agreement in Hamilton County is required to pay 100% of the school portion of property taxes.

Chairman Smedley thanked Mayor Coppinger and staff for the three budget workshops.
