Commissioner Bankston gave the invocation and led in the pledge to the flag.

PRESENTATION - TOBACCO FREE CHATTANOOGA

Dr. Sean Richards, Chairman of Tobacco Free Chattanooga, presented a plaque to Commissioners and Mayor Coppinger for their support in designating Hamilton County a smoke free community. He explained currently the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) prohibits smoking in public housing and establishes a perimeter of 25 feet around buildings, but Section 8 housing and private rental homes are not included in the smoking ban. He spoke about the increasing amount of research on the dangers of second and third hand smoke, especially on children and elderly individuals. Dr. Richards explained chemicals left behind from smoke could stick to walls and furniture and negatively affect the health of future tenants.

Dr. Richards introduced Director of Community Health Services Bill Ulmer,
Tobacco Prevention Coordinator Paula Collier, and Public Health Educator Megan
Bernard.

In response to Commissioner Baker's question, Dr. Richards spoke about the recent spike in respiratory illnesses and deaths related to vaping. He emphasized vaping is not a safe alternative to smoking and noted very little research and data is available on the products.

In response to Commissioner Geter's question, Ms. Collier explained how

Tobacco Free Chattanooga works with the Health Department and Chattanooga Public

Housing to educate the community on the dangers of tobacco use and reduce the use

of smoking in the public housing system.

In response to Commissioner Mackey's question, Dr. Richards stated smoke from marijuana also leaves behind chemicals that can be harmful.

In response to Commissioner Sharpe's question, Dr. Richards confirmed the majority of research on marijuana comes from private groups.

Commissioner Smedley spoke about her concerns with the congestion along Ooltewah-Ringgold Road. She stated that road is being quickly developed with approximately 1,000 lots currently under construction. She reported the community has held meetings to discuss the fast growth in the area and voiced concerns about growth outpacing infrastructure. Commissioner Smedley stated the road is on the priority list to be widened, however it would still be 8 to 10 years before that happens. She encouraged Commissioners to visit Ooltewah-Ringgold Road during school arrival and dismissal to see the congestion firsthand. She noted she would be giving a presentation on the matter in the near future.

Commissioner Mackey suggested contacting the Governor's Office to seek assistance in the road-widening project.

Commissioner Boyd stated Hamilton County is pro-growth and should not allow a few hundred people to dictate what is best for the entire county. He encouraged Commissioners to work with the state and developers in order to improve infrastructure in order to keep up with development and not stifle growth.

Commissioner Mackey agreed with Commissioner Boyd's comments and added that funding schools adequately is also important to growth.

Commissioner Bankston provided details regarding Resolution No. 919-32 and stated the Zoning Committee reviewed and recommended approval.

ON MOTION of Commissioner Bankston, seconded by Commissioner Mackey, to adopt Resolution No. 919-32. The foregoing Motion was unanimously adopted on a Roll Call vote, with the following members of the County Commission being present and voting as follows: Commissioner Baker, "Aye", Commissioner Bankston, "Aye", Commissioner Boyd, "Aye", Commissioner Geter, "Aye", Commissioner Mackey, "Aye", Commissioner Martin, "Aye", Commissioner Sharpe, "Aye", Commissioner Smedley, "Aye", and Chairman Fairbanks, "Aye". Commissioner Mackey encouraged Commissioners to address sewage treatment options in Hamilton County.

Commissioner Martin spoke about growth and the impact on schools, taxes, and economic development.

Commissioner Sharpe recognized Superintendent of Schools Dr. Bryan Johnson and the Department of Education for ending the year under budget and providing a \$550 additional bonus for teachers.

Commissioner Boyd spoke about the importance of following proper procedure in committee meetings. He referred to the Legal and Legislative Committee Meeting on August 28th and reminded Commissioners that committees do not vote on items but are designed to bring forth recommendations to the whole Commission.

Commissioner Boyd voiced concerns about fragile and aging infrastructure and referred to the recent water crisis where Tennessee American Water had a major water main break, which left around 35,000 without water for up to three days.

Mayor Coppinger addressed the water crisis emergency, which began Thursday night and lasted through late Sunday evening. He credited Marc Ericson, Deputy Director of the Hamilton County Office of Emergency Management, who coordinated the entire effort that involved 55 agencies from around the east Tennessee region. Mayor Coppinger commended the organization of the response teams and the job they did of gathering and relaying accurate information.

1:20:03

Deputy Director Ericson stated the group began responding to the emergency within one hour of the news of the water main break on Thursday until around 4:00 PM Monday afternoon. He detailed the response efforts and stated the team did an outstanding job providing bottled water to the community and staging water tanks in order to assist hospitals and fire departments. He reported the full extent of the cost of the emergency is being gathered. It was noted the county has to account for every penny it spent in order to be reimbursed by the Tennessee Emergency Management Agency (TEMA).

Mayor Coppinger introduced Vonda Patrick who recently joined the Finance Department. He announced Administrator of Finance Al Kiser would most likely be retiring within the next year.

Clerk Knowles spoke about how his office handled the water crisis, which closed the Courthouse on Friday. He stated that the Courthouse tag and title staff was assigned to the Bonny Oaks vehicle branch to accommodate the large number of tag applicants affected by the crisis.

Commissioner Baker thanked Deputy Director Ericson for the water crisis response. In response to Commissioner Baker's question, Mayor Coppinger stated a presentation honoring first responders who traveled to Florida to provide relief efforts during Hurricane Dorian would take place next week.
