**PRESENTATION – CERTIFICATE OF CONGRATULATIONS – RYAN MARTIN**

Commissioner Fairbanks presented Ryan Martin with a certificate of congratulations for winning the World Boxing Council's Continental Americas lightweight title and for his outstanding community service assisting the Chattanooga Y-Cap program in various capacities. Commissioner Fairbanks highlighted a few of the many awards and accolades Mr. Martin has received throughout his boxing career, which began at the Chattanooga based Y-Cap boxing club "Jabbin' for Jesus".

Mr. Martin, a graduate of Central High School, is speaking at the school today. His mother, Rhonda Albert, and mentors Joe Smith, Y-Cap Regional Director, and Andy Smith, Y-Cap Program Director and Head Boxing Coach joined Mr. Martin at the podium. Commissioner Fairbanks presented Mr. Martin with a plaque to congratulate him on his dedication, discipline, and exceptional sportsmanship, and for bringing prestige and recognition to Hamilton County with his astounding record of 16 wins and 0 losses.

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Mr. Martin thanked Commissioners for the honor. He noted that while living in Cleveland, Ohio, he follows Chattanooga news through social media. He spoke about the string of violence in Chattanooga, and stated that both his younger brother and high school friend were victims of shooting violence within the last year. He stated that he wants to inspire young people to make better choices regardless of their backgrounds or circumstances, and to work hard to achieve what you want in life. At this time, Mr. Martin was given a standing ovation.

Commissioner Mackey called Mr. Martin a great ambassador for our community. He stated that discretionary funds are useful to help support programs like the Y-Cap Boxing Club that aim to reduce violence in the community.
