Agriculture and Livestock Rules and Regulations

PLEASE NOTE CHECK-IN DATES AND TIMES!!!

1. Registration deadline for mailed application is to be postmarked by September 17, 2018. Online registration deadline is September 24, 2018. Entry form must be received by deadline.
2. All vegetable and field crop items must be checked in at the pavilion building on Thursday, September 27, between 2:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. Entries received after 6:00 p.m. will not be eligible for judging.
3. All items are to be picked up on Sunday, September 30, between 7:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. Vehicles will not be allowed into the fairgrounds until 7:00 p.m. due to pedestrian and bus traffic. You must have a claim ticket to claim your items.
4. Any items not claimed by 8:00 p.m. will be disposed of at the discretion of the Fair Committee.
5. Most classes are open to youth (6-18 years old) and adults, with the exception of Poultry (youth only, 9 to 18 years of age). Youth and adult entries will be judged separately in all agriculture classes.
6. Winners will receive ribbons and premiums as follows:
1st - \$5 2nd - \$4 3rd - \$3 Best of Class - \$5 Best of Show - \$5 (Departments 1 and 2)
7. All items must have been produced and/or grown by the entrant within the last 12 months.
8. Participants may enter only one time per lot. Participant may have multiple entries in classes.
9. The County Fair is not responsible for broken, stolen, or spoiled items.

Poultry Rules and Regulations

PLEASE NOTE CHECK-IN DATES AND TIMES!!!

1. Poultry Show entries, by mail only, must be received by the entry deadline (postmarked by September 17, 2018). Space is limited and The Hamilton County Fair reserves the right to close registration.
2. Participants must be Hamilton County residents.
3. All entries, including 4-H Poultry Project birds, must be checked in at Shelter 1 and then taken to the Poultry Tent, Thursday, September 27, between 4:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. A negative blood agglutination test will be conducted or health papers must be presented showing, within 90 days, negative test. Birds may be subject to oral swab for Avian Influenza surveillance.
4. All entries may be picked up on Sunday, September 30, between 7:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. Vehicles will not be allowed in or out of the fairgrounds area until 7:00 p.m. due to pedestrian and bus traffic.
5. Open Youth Class includes ages 9 to 18 years of age. No adult class.
6. Only those poultry breeds listed on the official entry form will be eligible for judging. The Hamilton County Fair reserves the right to reject any entry.
7. Any specimen showing symptoms of disease when received or during the exhibit will be immediately removed from the exhibition tent and returned to the owner.
8. The judge will be empowered to withdraw prizes when in his/her opinion specimens are not of sufficient merit. Judge will not award premiums to any bird because of its presence. The entry must be individually worthy.
9. No birds may be removed from the exhibit area without the consent of the Agriculture Committee Chair.
10. The Fair Association will give the birds proper attention but will not be responsible for loss or damage which may occur.
11. All poultry entries must be accompanied by health papers issued by a licensed veterinarian indicating a negative blood agglutination test for Pullorum Disease within the last ninety days and/or the birds are to be tested (see #3 above).

There are four classes (Cocks, Hens, Cockerels, and Pullets) in each variety of each breed.

Classes are thus defined: Cocks and Hens are birds one year old or over.

Cockerels and Pullets are birds less than one year old.

See complete list of entries for all breeds and varieties.

Winners will be awarded premiums as follows:

1st - \$5 and blue ribbon

2nd - \$4 and red ribbon

3rd - \$3 and white ribbon

Best of Show - \$10.00 (open show only)
